
ESSENCE (ECONOMICS-OF-SOCIAL-CARE-COMPENDIUM) **CONTINUATION STUDY**

What is the ESSENCE project and its aim:

- It is an online resource which is free to access.
- It is a comprehensive collection that brings together relevant pre-existing research, together with new findings on costs or cost-effectiveness generated mainly through simulation modelling.
- It currently contains 18 case studies covering a range of adult social care interventions as well as a database of relevant publications on a broader spectrum of adult social care interventions.
- Its aim is to support decision-makers to access and understand the economic evidence for adult social care interventions (organised in 'bundles' of evidence, see figure below).
- We want the toolkit to be useful for people outside as well as within the research community.
